Our documents exemplify two opposed viewpoints: on the one hand (doc 1), a Filipino cartoon, which criticizes Chinese imperialism. On the other hand, a vindication of the Chinese claims by a Chinese statesman and military leader. Geopolitics is the science of tensions and conflicts in international relations. We are going to see that the SCS is a hot spot.

## Tensions in the South China Sea.

• Cartoon on the Chinese claims in the South China Sea, published by the *Philippine Daily* Inquirer on 30 December 2017. A dragon's paw occupied a large part of the cartoon. It stands for Chinese imperialism. The Filipinos I'M JUST TESTING THE WATERS... protest because China's imperialism is likely to deprive them of their territorial waters and EEZ. The words of the dragon are an understatement, which makes the cartoon funny, even though the issue isn't SOUTH that funny. It is a maritime dispute. In the context of globalization, The place is the SCS. sea power (or the control of the seas) is foremost. The dragon's toes draw a broken line, veryt similar to the 9-dash line, the line that represents Chinese claims China is currently occupying the area, especially in the Paracels and Spratly islands, now under Chinese

Chinese resolve to reconquer Taiwan. They consider that Taiwan is in a state of secession, and that Chinese unity is foremost.
